### TEACHER'S SEMINARS PRESENTATION FOR BENEFIT OF TEACHERS & STUDENTS

Dr. Ranjita Kumari acquainted the students about experiential learning and insisted it provides an active learning environment for students allowing them to purposefully engage in developing a solution to a problem. The real-world application provides value and context to the learning experience, enhancing student interest and motivation. She described about Bloom Taxonomy which described about cognitive learning. Three are six levels are remembering, understanding, applying, analyzing, evaluating, and creating. The experiential learning is one of the cognitive stages of learning about which the bloom taxonomy basically discussed about.

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Dr. Anjum Waris discussed about the constitutional provisions for the compulsory education. His main argument was based on the preamble and education. He insisted that a number of efforts have been initiated in India to make elementary education a fundamental right of every child. With the passing of the 93<sup>rd</sup> Constitution Amendment Bill, a major stride was witnessed in the evolution of the 93<sup>rd</sup> Constitution Amendment Bill into the 86th Constitution Amendment Act. With this Act, for the first time since the framing of the Constitution, was a Fundamental Right added to the Constitution of India. He described different constitutional provision for the compulsory education for every child. He argued that after passing of two decades of 93<sup>rd</sup> constitutional amendment we could not achieve 100 percent literacy and asked the students and teachers to impart education to under privileged students. He described how idea enlisted in the preamble promotes education for all section of the society.
